School Characteristics

Founded in 1928, Whitinsville Christian School is a distinctively Christian school with the Bible, the Word of God, as its foundation. WCS has a 40 acre campus, which includes a new state-of-the-art performing arts center and athletic building, library media center, cross country trail, gymnasium, two soccer fields, a softball field, six tennis courts, and an outdoor track. Graduates meet and exceed the requirements set forth by the Massachusetts Department of Education.

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Graduation Requirements

To be eligible for a diploma from WCS, a student must complete the course of studies prescribed by the WCS Board of Directors. Seniors must successfully complete 129 credits. Full-year courses are worth 5 credits each; semester courses are worth 2.5 credits each.

Students are required to complete a minimum of 15 hours of service work each year for a total of 60 hours before graduation. Total hours earned are indicated on the transcript.

International Students

WCS welcomes the cultural diversity that international students bring to our school. Seventeen international students who represent China, Korea, and Taiwan are currently enrolled in the high school for the 2018/2019 school year. International students who attend WCS are expected to be proficient in the English language, to follow the same curriculum as all other students, and to meet the same graduation requirements.

AP/Honors

Students completing AP credit are awarded a GPA adjustment of +.50. AP courses offered include Art 2-D Design, Art 3-D Design, Calculus AB, English Language, English Literature & Composition, European History, Music Theory, Physics, US Government & Politics, and US History.

Students completing Honors credit are awarded a GPA adjustment of +.30. We have Honors Biology, Chemistry, English 9, 10, and 11 courses, and Spanish I and II. A Marine Biology course is taught during alternate summers. Honors Components are offered in Accounting I and II, Algebra II, Anatomy & Physiology, Ecology, and Spanish III and IV. Honors component credits are earned within the regular course by means of extra assignments. Summer work is required of students enrolled in all AP, Honors, and Honors component classes.

AP Scores

From 2014-2018, 269 students have taken AP exams with 76% earning a 3 or higher.

2017 Score 3+: 72 students out of 112

2016 Score 3+: 37 students out of 41

2015 Score 3+: 25 students out of 37

2014 Score 3+: 32 students out of 56
