## Whitinsville Christian High School Service Hours Requirement

Service is an important part of a comprehensive Christian education. Service provides the opportunity to apply what has been learned in the home, at church, and in the classroom.

Benefits:

- Obedience to God's command
- Expression of love for God
- Development of Christian maturity
- Sharing of individual gifts
- Encouragement of leadership skills
- Preparation for the future

Students who have participated in service opportunities have a greater understanding of themselves and their roles in the church, community, and school. They are better equipped to make realistic decisions about career goals and future plans. Students are more qualified candidates for employment, college admissions, scholarships and various types of financial aid.

Requirement: Each year of high school, students are required to complete 15 hours of service doing at least two different activities. Serving in more than one activity to more than one audience enriches the experience for the students. Students are encouraged to report ALL service hours beyond the requirement, as all hours will be included on the high school transcript and looked upon favorably by colleges/universities.

In-school: Includes opportunities that directly impact the students and community of WCS. Such activities might include peer-tutoring, events, sports team manager, teacher/office aides (noncredit), Apple Pie fundraiser, Treasures Thrift Store volunteer, Spring Auction volunteer, visitor host, etc. Note, service done to raise money that directly impacts the student (class funds, for example) does not count towards the requirement.

Out-of-school: Includes service in church or in the community. Church related service includes voluntary commitments in Sunday school or Children's Ministry, choir or praise band, mission trips, outreach activities, VBS or similar programs, work done for upkeep of the church building or grounds, etc. Community related service includes nursing home visits, food pantry volunteer, hospital volunteer, town clean-up day, camp volunteer, youth sports volunteer coaching, etc.

Opportunities not accepted: helping immediate or extended family members at home or work, working in lieu of being paid at a for-profit business, travel time to and from places of service. When in doubt, ask the office.
