Throughout her tenure at WCS, she has consistently demonstrated a heartfelt dedication to guiding students on a path of holistic education, emphasizing not only academic excellence, but also spiritual and personal growth.

Expressing her gratitude and excitement about the new role, Sarah shares, “I am grateful for the support and encouragement I’ve received, and I am excited to make the shift from Interim to Head of School. 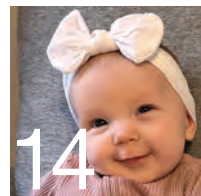

# Benjamin Moore Finds Harmony in Music and Faith

As a Christian school, WCS teaches the themes of creation, fall, redemption, and restoration in many classes, in many ways. Our own lives also follow these themes, and we are thankful that *Benjamin Moore (Class of 2006)* has shared his story.

**B**en, now performing as Benjamin Salt, returned to the Whitinsville Christian stage at our Pops Concert, the opening event for Homecoming 2023. To round out his WCS Homecoming, he also performed at an alumni reception, and sang the National Anthem at the Friday night volleyball game. “I loved being back at WCS,” said Ben. “It reminded me of so many meaningful connections and friendships. I enjoyed being on the cross country team, not because I loved the sport, but because I loved the camaraderie of the team. I know it can be challenging being a Christian in Massachusetts, but you can feel God’s presence at WCS. He’s still working here.”

Benjamin discovered his passion for music during his time at WCS, thanks to the encouragement and guidance of his dedicated music teachers, Franz and Joanne Kuder. He fondly remembers his WCS experience as the catalyst for his musical journey. “The Kuders are just amazing teachers, and wonderful people. I was so encouraged and supported in my pursuit of opportunities.” These sentiments are shared frequently by WCS alumni. “I learned so much about singing technique, and Mrs. Kuder’s Music Theory course provided an incredible head start for my college courses.”



Ben enrolled at Olivet Nazarene University and began pursuing a degree in Marketing with a minor in Music. But life took an unexpected turn during his college years when his parents divorced. “It broke me. The stability I had relied on was shattered.” He decided to drop out of college and embarked on a journey that eventually led him to the Chicago area, where he “got involved with the party scene and lost myself in addiction.”

It wasn’t until 2018 that he began to turn his life around. He became active in theater in Chicago and started to feel the stirrings of faith and spirituality. Witnessing tragedies and hardships made him reflect on the fragility of life, prompting a profound realization: it was time to reconnect with his faith.

“In May of 2019, I knew I needed to give my life back to Jesus.” He made the decision to return to Olivet to complete his degree. “By the time the pandemic started, I felt my faith dwindling again. I didn’t want to be the seed that was thrown down on hard ground. I felt a calling leading me to Nashville, although I didn’t initially plan to pursue music there.” In Nashville, he found a welcoming church



community at Nashville Life Church. “I was warmly welcomed, and discipled by men of God, who were mature in their faith.”

As his faith deepened, he began making connections in the music industry, setting the stage for his forthcoming album. “My EP, *The Mess I Made*, was released on November 3, and my first album will be released next year. The album, not surprisingly, is about what happens after you choose Jesus. I believe true faith is one’s own journey, and one’s own realization. I feel so blessed to be sharing my music and my journey.”



# ~ FLEX PROJECTS ~

Innovative approaches to teaching are continually emerging to transform traditional teaching methods and cultivate engaged, lifelong learners. Teaching for Transformation (TfT) is one of these approaches and WCS is in its second year of a three-year implementation. One of the core practices of TfT is the FLEX Project, opportunities for the learner to engage in “real work that meets a real need for real people.” These projects

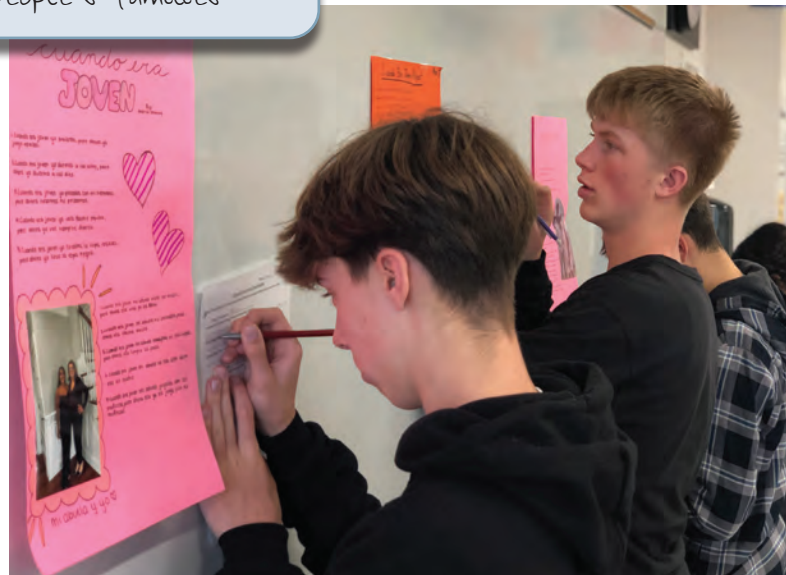
go beyond conventional lesson plans, fostering a holistic learning environment that emphasizes character formation, critical thinking, and real-world application of knowledge. As they delve into these FLEX projects, our students see how their work in the classroom can impact the community around them, and help them become empowered contributors to society.

## Cuando Era Joven ~ Connecting Generations

Kelly Penning’s Spanish II students are celebrating the diversity of stories. Each student is exploring their own childhood and comparing it with their current life, sharing the differences. The next part of the project involves comparing someone else’s life (at least two generations older) to their life now, sharing the differences. The final written project must, of course, be completed in Spanish. “I loved doing this FLEX project with my students,” said Kelly. “It is an adaptation of a project I usually do each year. But, with a TfT focus, I was able to be more intentional with my learning targets and essential questions.” Students learned to celebrate the diversity of stories and build relationships with others. “I loved learning about the past of other people’s families, along with my own, and how Miss Penning tied that into learning how to speak in the past tense,” said Kacy Brochu, sophomore. “The life-giving nature of having different generations interact and share stories was a blessing for me to observe!” said Kelly.



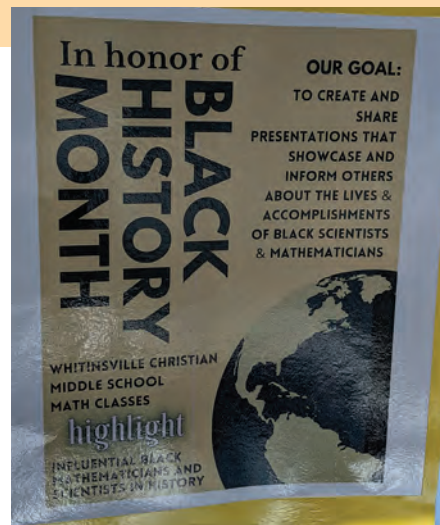

# LET'S CELEBRATE ~

## Black History Mathematicians



Heather Holgate's Deep Hope (another Tft core practice) for herself and her students is to courageously explore and do mathematics, discovering order and patterns in God's creation, and applying those discoveries to solve real problems for real people. As a middle school math & Bible teacher, she wants her students to see the beauty of mathematics in their everyday lives, and how they can use it to solve real problems for real people.



“Researching how other mathematicians have gone before them and how their courageous explorations have uncovered amazing discoveries shows students what they are capable of doing,” said Heather. In this FLEx, students conducted detailed research about the life and work of their chosen African American mathematician or scientist. “Students researched the math and science their person uncovered and used in their work. When we were finished, the students told me they enjoyed the project, advocating for others, persevering when things are difficult, and doing a small part to help restore relationships.” Her students shared reflections such as, “Euphemia Haynes’ story shows that you can overcome anything. She did things that were not expected of African American women. She worked hard to get a real education, and she... used her tal-

ents to teach and to push to desegregate schools. She was passionate about Black children getting a real education and made a big impact on the world.” and “I struggle with how unjustly my scientist was treated and how others took credit for her work. This project has me thinking deeply about how I can be a Justice Seeker and how I might have brought a little piece of fixing and restoration to a broken part of our history by letting others know of her great work.”

“Students communicated how their mathematician or scientist impacted and influenced the world despite adversity, inequities, and sometimes grave injustices,” said Heather. “This FLEx exceeded my expectations, opened up deep learning opportunities, and made a lasting impact on students and me as their teacher!”

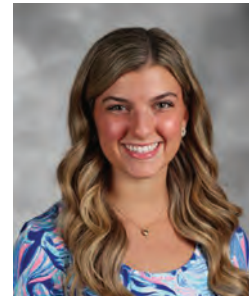

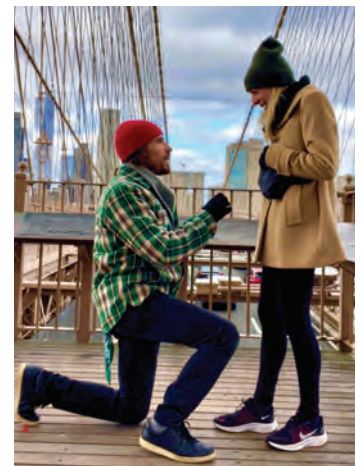
